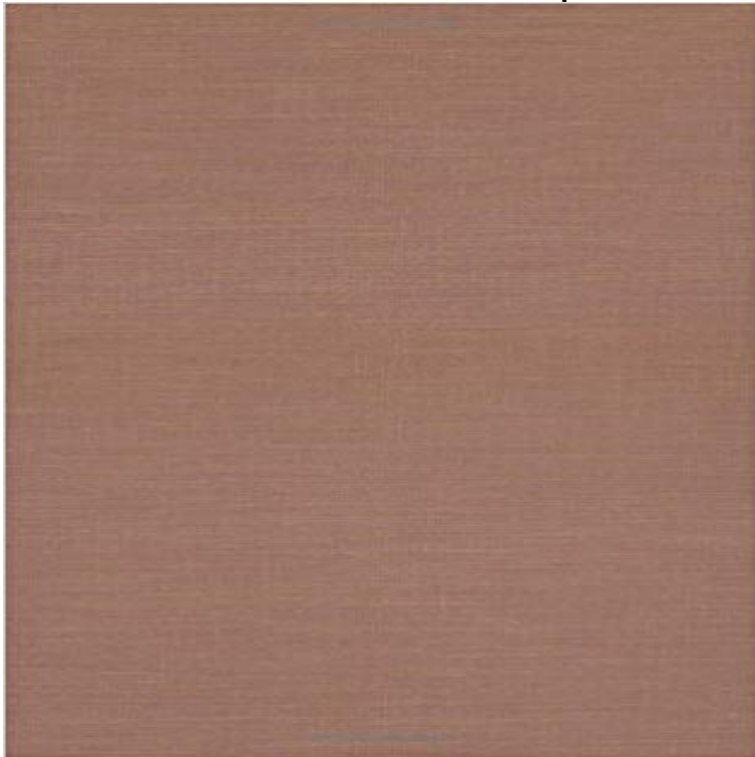


Confession and Community in Seventeenth-Century France: Catholic and Protestant Coexistence in Aquitaine
