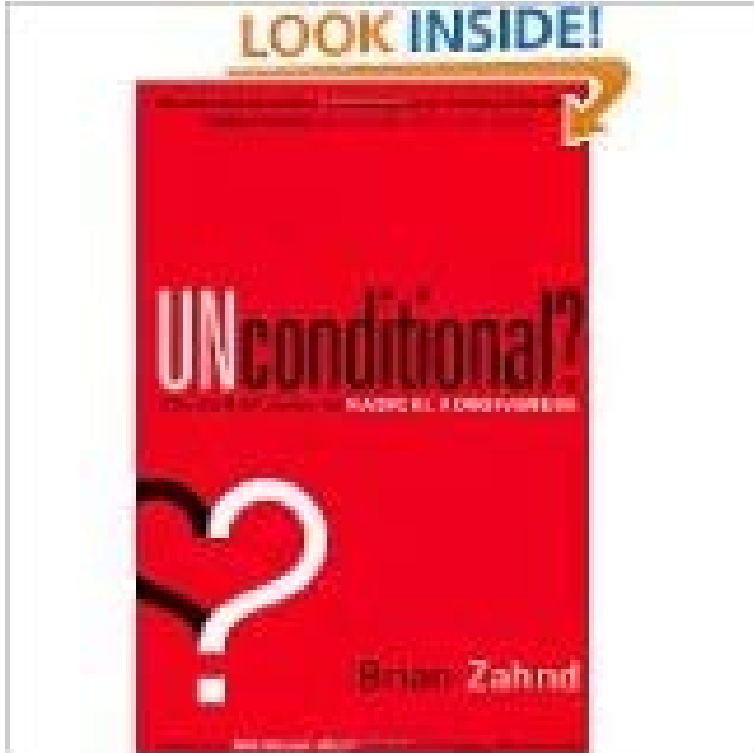


Unconditional?: The call of Jesus to radical forgiveness
